A Woman on a Mission

Did you know that as of June 2017, 773 dogs have already gone missing in Missouri this year? In the same time frame, there have been 610 sightings.

The saddest fact: In Missouri, this year 606 dogs have been found... and they're still unclaimed.

Shuma Chaudhuri looks like a woman who might work in the office next to you, like she could be your neighbor. It's true she doesn't dress like a nun nor does she wear a superhero's cape. However Shuma is on a mission, and if she does have a super power, it's an endless supply of energy. The phone calls, the Facebook work, the texts and the constant stream of information she's inundated with—it's all in effort to get lost dogs and cats back home. Her group is Missouri Lost & Found Paws. As Shuma said, "Every pet we get home, that leaves a space (in a shelter or foster home) for a truly unwanted dog or cat." Check out their Facebook page *Missouri Lost & Found Paws*. This site is full of information.



There are many things pet owners can do to be proactive. If it's a LAGR dog you're worried about, the rescue group has your back if that pup ever gets lost. When a lost Love a Golden Rescue dog is found and scanned, LAGR is always a back up contact number, and can then contact you... as long as your information is still valid.

Have you changed your phone number? Do you no longer have a landline? Have you changed your email, or have you moved? If you've answered "yes" to any of those questions, please email adoption@loveagolden.com with your new information, and we'll be happy to update your dog's microchip information. (If you know your LAGR dog's number, that would expedite things.)

If you lose a dog, or if you want to prevent your dog from staying "lost," here are some steps you should take:

- Use a zip (cable) tie to make sure tags stay on a dog's collar. Attach them to the larger ring on the collar, not one of the flimsy rings that come with rabies tags.
- Write your phone number on the inside of your dog's collar using a permanent marker.
- When was the last time you took a photo of your dog? (If you don't have a good picture because your dog's so energetic, get a screenshot from a video.) Do you know your dog's measurements? Many dogs look alike in regards to coloring. Measure from the neck to the tail. Measure the length of the tail. All that information could go on a poster.
- Shelters often have a "stray hold" area. If you don't see your lost pet in the adoption area, ask to see the pets in the stray hold.
- In the St. Louis metro area, go to <http://www.stlostpets.org/> You can report your dog or cat lost or search for dogs and cats which have been turned in.
- If you have a friend who has a pet that's not chipped, St. Louis Carol House's clinic does microchipping for \$20, and in St. Charles County, the Pet Adoption Center will microchip for a \$10 fee.



If you find a stray, this is what you can do:

- Take the found dog/cat to the closest vet or shelter where you found the pet—not the shelter closest to your home, because most pets are found wandering close to their home.
- Make large "found" posters. White poster board is fine except in winter. (Use colorful poster board in wintery months, so the signs don't blend in with the snow.) Also, put signs on different streets. Leave one important detail off sign so the owner has to identify something no one else would know.
- When taking a lost pet into a vet/ shelter to be scanned, the microchip company might say, "No, it's not registered." If this happens, please ask, "Who owns/placed the microchip?" (For example, Love a Golden Rescue is registered as the original "owner" of all LAGR dogs' microchips.)
- If you take a stray into the vet, and they don't find a chip, ask if they have another scanner. Some veterinarians don't have a universal scanner.

Shuma posts when deceased dogs are found, so owners can find closure. Families have called her to thank her, saying "It's so good to know instead of forever wondering what happened."

Shuma developed a particular fondness for Love a Golden Rescue after seeing how three Love a Golden Rescue friends—Pam Bogle and the Prouhet's came to help a stray dog. Before then, they had never met Shuma. They helped her set a trap, and they helped her check it hourly. Eventually, two dogs were found (apparently they were canine buddies). Love a Golden Rescue was asked if we would find homes, and eventually both Misha and Walden were adopted by Shuma's sister and now are spoiled rotten pups. After this happened, Shuma said, "I had to give back." Luckily, for all the lost dogs and cats, Shuma doesn't stop giving back...

Hi

As I prepare the "Happy Endings" section for this newsletter, I'm touched by how much we love our dogs, especially our adopted ones. They are all so lucky. They look so wonderful, especially the dogs flown in from Turkey. Those international furry friends are all such beautiful goldens since starting their life in the USA.

Without all of you, we could not continue our journey of rescuing and saving. The response to our Valentine appeal was overwhelming, and for that, we thank you. We've had a few dogs who needed extensive vet care. For example, Yogi needed heartworm treatment, hip and entropion surgery. It took months to get him on the road to recovery, but he is a happy, healthy dog and is now in a great home. Puff had life-saving surgery shortly after she came to rescue. She had Lumbosacral Stenosis and was in tremendous pain. It was not known for some time after surgery if she would be pain-free, or if she would recover. Puff is looking for a home with a ranch layout. She needs to be an only dog as she cannot play, and she needs to be with a quiet, laid-back family. She is a smaller doodle girl--very loving and sweet. We have a couple of dogs who were heartworm positive: Sammuell just finished his treatment and is now in a great home and Lady Jane, a senior is currently undergoing heartworm treatment. Sadly, this is the second time in her life to have to endure this treatment. Luckily, she has a home waiting for her once her treatment is complete. As I write this, I did hear about another heartworm positive dog who needs to be rescued. If only every dog was given preventative, our work would be easier, and the dogs would be happier and healthier...

Many thanks also to those who donated to GiveSTLDay. We were thrilled with the great response.

We are looking forward to our Trivia Night on August 19th. The flyer is in this newsletter. Our tables fill up fast, so please sign up early.

Our reunion picnic is September 16th. This is my favorite event of the year. I get to see so many wonderful goldens in one place, and everyone has fun. No matter if you have two legs or four legs--it's an enjoyable time for all. I hope you can make it.

ASK ELSA

Dear Elsa,

I keep hearing about how much fun swimming is. What do I need to do in order to swim safely? What kinds of things do I need to get into my doggy brain?

Dear CMSF,

Your experience in a pool or a lake/ocean/river can go swimmingly (pun intended) if you follow a few guidelines.

- Have your people begin with you close to the steps (in a pool) and make sure you're facing the stairs. Gradually work your way to deeper water.
- Wait for 2-4 hours after eating to take a dip. (Bloat would put a damper on any pool party.)
- Consider a life vest if you're a senior or if you have a brother or sister who's a short-legged breed. One with handles is great and if your two-leggers order them from chewy.com (Outward Hound Pupsaver Ripstop Dog Life Jacket), they're affordable at \$25.
- Be careful. Never go swimming if there's a strong current. If there's blue or blue-green algae, stay away (that algae could be toxic) and look out for slippery areas. Sometimes the bank of a river or the edge of a lake is hard to navigate, causing you to slip.
- Even though you're surrounded by all that water, do not drink it. Ocean water will dehydrate you, and lake/pond water can be the home for parasites which will give you diarrhea. You want to run into the water, not get the runs *from* the water. If you gulp down some water, make sure your people get you onto dry land and give you a drink from a water bottle.
- Once you're done with your dip, ask your people to rinse you off with fresh water, get your collar taken off and get toweled dry. You don't want to get any hot spots from your cool swim.

Let me know how your swimming goes this summer. I'm sure you'll enjoy it.

Destiny (formerly Violet) Having fun in the sun, she is a beautiful girl.




Dudley is a happy boy and settling in. We are getting some obedience training, and we love him so much. He is so loving and cuddly with all of us.

Brandy went to the bridge on March 10, 2017.

It was such a difficult decision. She had stopped eating. She started shaking this morning. She couldn't move without falling. I am much relieved that she is no longer suffering. It just hurts my heart.

Chewbacca formerly Chewy - Crossed the Rainbow Bridge March 18, 2017. Chewy was found in a high kill shelter in Illinois with 12 hours left for an adoption. I only saw pictures of Chewy's side view but never his face..I thought he was camera shy. We were wrong. He was such a loving dog, the shelter staff "adjusted his hair color", so he could be rescued by a golden rescue. With the assistance of a good friend, he was pulled from the shelter with a few minutes to spare. Chewy was a bit of a surprise when I saw his brown face, blond fur and a heart of gold. He was lovable from the start and totally captured my heart as well as my mom's.

Chewy was initially in training for K9 SAR, but after he started to limp after some extended field exercises, we found out he had a bad hip as well as buckshot in his hip area. Chewy trained and became a therapy dog. He brought happiness to everyone, visiting nursing homes or sick children. He loved wearing his "outfits." When I got married in 2014, he gave me away in his tux. He loved doing LAGR gift wraps, and somehow he knew the difference between change and dollar bills. He would bounce up and down on his front paws till someone put in more cash.



Lulu (formerly Jeannie) sadly went to the bridge on May 4th, 2017. She was adopted in 2013.

Our beloved Colbie (formerly Kerry) was called to the Rainbow Bridge much too soon! We had to make the difficult decision to let her go after being diagnosed with LPE a few weeks ago. She was an amazing dog, and she is going to be missed greatly! She came to us as a sweet, gangly 1 1/2 year old and gave us love, patience, comfort and joy. Our hearts are heavy with her passing, but we know she is enjoying her afterlife in doggie heaven without any pain or suffering.
