The Biggest Loser - The Golden Way

Maggie Moo--The Biggest Winner at Losing (Weight)

Elsa normally writes her ever-popular advice column for the newsletter, however, she decided to mix things up and is interviewing Maggie Moo instead.

ELSA: Good afternoon Ms. Moo. May I call you Maggie?

MAGGIE: Certainly, I much prefer to be called Maggie.

ELSA: Can you tell me--why were you surrendered to Love a Golden Rescue?

MAGGIE: My former owner died, and no one in the family wanted to take care of me.

ELSA: That must have been heartbreaking! When was it that you came to rescue?

MAGGIE: In October of 2010...

ELSA: Do you remember what you were like, right before you got rescued by Love a Golden?

MAGGIE: Yes, at that time I weighed 117 pounds. I was filthy, matted and did not smell too good. I didn't feel well at all. I heard people say I looked like a coffee table, a cartoon character... it was embarrassing. It was horrible!

ELSA: I'm so sorry you had to endure that. How old are you, Maggie?

MAGGIE: I am told I am 12 years old. Back in October 2010, I felt a lot older, but now I feel like I am younger than 12. I've got a youthful spring in my step!

ELSA: How did you get so overweight? What was happening in your life that allowed things to get so out-of-control?

MAGGIE: I love food! My owner fed me a coffee can of dry dog food and 4 cans of Alpo a day, and of course I really enjoyed it and ate it all up. I did not realize my waistline was getting out of control. I know my owners thought they were doing the right thing—since I loved to eat—but really the overeating was slowly killing me...

ELSA: That is a lot of food! I imagine when you came to rescue it was a shock to not eat so much? Did you think Love a Golden was trying to starve you to death?

MAGGIE: Yes, it was a shock in the beginning. At first, I was eating Pro Plan which was delicious, but I did not get very much, and I was always hungry. After being in rescue for a while, my food was changed to OM Weight Management. I could eat more, as it is low in calories, and it helped put me on my road to losing weight. I also get a few green beans with my supper. The treats I receive are low calorie too.

ELSA: When you were so overweight, were there things you could not do?


MAGGIE: Yes. I could not climb a flight of stairs. I could do a couple of stairs to the deck but would get out of breath. I also could not walk on slick floors for fear of falling.

ELSA: How is your mobility now?

MAGGIE: I can climb a flight of stairs, and I no longer have any problems with floors.

ELSA: Do you have any medical problems?

MAGGIE: I do have a thyroid issue, and I am on medication for that. Otherwise, I am a healthy lady.

ELSA: Have you done anything else to lose weight?

MAGGIE: Yes, at first I went on one walk every day and could barely make it around the circle where my foster home is. I would huff and puff and was so glad when I got home. As I lost weight and got to feeling better, I went on two walks a day. Now most days I go on three walks a day...

ELSA: How long are your walks now?

MAGGIE: My morning walk is around the circle, not far at all. My midday walk on cooler days is a mile, but if it is hot, I go ½ mile. My evening walk is about 1/3rd of a mile. My dog walkers are dedicated, and usually we take a Golden friend to walk with me which is fun.

ELSA: How do you feel about these walks?

MAGGIE: I love them! If I think my foster family has forgotten that it's time for a walk, I do become a pest and bother them until they put the leash on me, and we head out the door. I take my weight loss very seriously. I'm on a mission!

ELSA: Has your weight loss been tracked?

MAGGIE: Yes, I am taken to the vet to be weighed every two weeks; my average weight loss is 1 pound a week, which is slow and steady. Each time I am always weighed on the same scale for consistency.

ELSA: Now for the big question, how much do you weigh today?

MAGGIE: I now weigh 75.5 pounds, a weight loss of 41.5 pounds. Isn't that incredible! I am quite proud of myself!

ELSA: That is wonderful! Congratulations! Have you done anything fun since losing all that weight?

MAGGIE: Yes, just recently I spent a few days at the lake, and I was allowed to go in the water. It felt so good, and I swam like a fish! I could never have even climbed down on the rocks if I had not lost all that weight.

ELSA: Other than rock climbing (chuckling) and swimming, do you have any other new hobbies?

MAGGIE: Yes I have found I like to chase tennis balls, and I also play with the other dogs in my foster home.

ELSA: Do you have advice for other dogs that have an ever-expanding waist line?

MAGGIE: Yes, cross your paws and hope your owner realizes you have a problem and does something to help you. I am so thankful; I am a new woman now that I'm slimmer, and I just love life! If you're a dog that feels like you are overweight, ask your vet to help and come up with a weight loss plan. It will change your life. Just like on that TV show, "The Biggest Loser." (In fact, I watch that show and dream of everyone watching *me* get on the scale as they cheer and clap for me.)

ELSA: What is your proudest moment?

MAGGIE: When people started to tell me I had a waist line and looked good. I was promised a spa day and just recently had it. I'm not going to tell you all the wonderful treatments I enjoyed, but I will say I relished all the grooming and the personalized pampering that took place.

ELSA: Thank you for being so honest about your weight, and good luck in the future.

Annie came to LAGR when she was 8. Although she was only with us for 6 years, she enriched our lives immeasurably. Always well-mannered, always eager to be with her people... and now always in our hearts. (Annie: Beginning on May 28, "carrot time" is all the time, and now you get to not only run after the bunnies and squirrels, you also get to catch them!) Michael and Sioux R.



On April 26, 2011 Maggie (Ruth) crossed over the bridge. She has been our sweetheart since 2006. Maggie was 12 or 13 years old. She came to us as a probable puppy mill dog. She gradually learned to trust us, and with her buddy's help (Minnie- Yes, we got her a dog companion) became our constant companion. Always wanting head scratches, ear and chin rubs, she soon became our resident sweetheart trekking after us wherever we went. She had gradually gone blind and deaf over the last year. Increased health issues caused us to make the decision on that day that she was suffering, and it was time to let her run free where she can see, hear and feel no pain. With tears we said good-bye to our beloved companion. She has given us such joy! We will miss her tremendously.

Bailey was dearly loved and had a wonderful life which ended all too soon.



We adopted Cedar in May of 2005. We learned he had developed Heart Arrhythmia in May of 2008. VSS saved his life and gave us three more wonderful years.

On Monday, March 7th, Cedar suffered a major seizure which caused severe brain damage. He was in a coma, and the outlook was bleak. He stayed overnight to determine if there was any improvement, but he never came out of the coma. He crossed the rainbow bridge on Tuesday, March 8th. My heart is filled with sadness, but I know

(Cedar with his sister Holly) he is in doggy heaven.

Max, 4 1/2 years old, crossed the bridge on March 4th due to aggressive Lymphoma that chemo couldn't control. We were blessed to get him as a puppy at 3 1/2 months. Thanks to LAGR's fostering & training, he was already housebroken and following commands. He never got in the way of all my oxygen tubing either. Because of Max, others wanted to rescue Golden Retrievers too, which meant he was extra special and good to everyone who met him! He was always Ron's buddy, but when Ron had a baseball-sized aneurysm removed in November 2010 and then a stroke, Max protected me, for two months, while Ron was in the hospital and then rehab. Max knew when Ron finally came home to be careful and not excite his master. We were shocked that this Lymphoma came on so suddenly in February. Two months and he was gone. Max will be missed and we will rescue another Golden again. Thank you LAGR for all you do! Ron & Marla H.

It is with great sadness to say we had to send Stoney Bear, who we adopted in 2005, to the Bridge. He was 13-years old and in the last two years he battled eye cancer, and finally what the vet believed was bladder cancer.

The Rescuer's Rainbow Bridge

Unlike most days at Rainbow Bridge, this day dawned cold and gray, damp as a swamp and as dismal as could be imagined. All the recent arrivals were confused and concerned. They had no idea what to think for they had never experienced a day like this before. But the animals that had spent some time waiting for their beloved people knew exactly what was happening and began to gather at the pathway leading to the Bridge to watch. They knew that this was something special.

It wasn't too long before an elderly animal came into view; head hung heavy and low with tail dragging along the ground. Although it was obvious the animal's heart was leaden, and he was totally overcome with emotional pain and hurt, there was no sign of injury or any illness. Unlike the pets waiting at the Bridge, this dog had not been restored to his prime. He was full of neither health nor vigor. He approached slowly and painfully, watching all the pets that were by now watching him.

He knew he was out of place here. This was no resting place for him. He felt instinctively that the sooner he could cross over, the happier he would be. But alas, as he came closer to the Bridge, his way was barred by the appearance of an Angel who spoke softly to the old dog and apologized sorrowfully, telling him that he would not be able to pass. Only those animals who were with their special people could pass over the Rainbow Bridge. He had no special beloved people...not here at the Bridge nor on Earth below.

With no place else to turn, the poor elderly dog looked toward the fields before the Bridge. There, in a separate area nearby, he spotted a group of other sad-eyed animals like himself...elderly and infirm. Unlike the pets waiting for their special people, these animals weren't playing but were simply lying on the green grass, forlornly and miserably staring out at the pathway leading to the Bridge. The recent arrival knew he had no choice but to join them. And so, he took his place among them, just watching the pathway and waiting.

One of the newest arrivals at the Bridge, who was waiting for his special people, could not understand what he had just witnessed and asked one of the pets who had been there for some time to explain it to him.

"That poor dog was abandoned, sent to the pound when his owner grew tired of him. The way you see him now, with graying fur and sad, cloudy eyes, was exactly the way he was when he was put into the kennels. He never, ever made it out and passed on, only with the love and comfort that the kennel workers could give him as he left his miserable and unloved existence on Earth for good. Because he had no family or special person to give his love, he has nobody to escort him across the Bridge."

The first animal thought about this for a minute and then asked, "So what will happen now?"

As he was about to receive his answer, the clouds suddenly parted and the all-invasive gloom lifted. Coming toward the Bridge could be seen a single figure...a person who, on Earth, had seemed quite ordinary...a person who, just like the elderly dog, had just left Earth forever. This figure turned toward a group of the sad animals and extended outstretched palms. The sweetest sounds they had ever heard echoed gently above them and all were bathed in a pure and golden light. Instantly, each was young and healthy again, just as they had been in the prime of life.

From within the gathering of pets waiting for their special people, a group of animals emerged and moved toward the pathway. As they came close to the passing figure, each bowed low and each received a tender pat on the head or a scratch behind the ears. Their eyes grew even brighter as the figure softly murmured each name. When a rescuer arrives, they are permitted to perform one final act of rescue. They are allowed to escort those poor pets that couldn't be placed on Earth across the Rainbow Bridge. You see, all animals are special to them...just as they are special to all animals."

"I think I like rescuers," said the recent arrival.

"So does God," was the reply.
