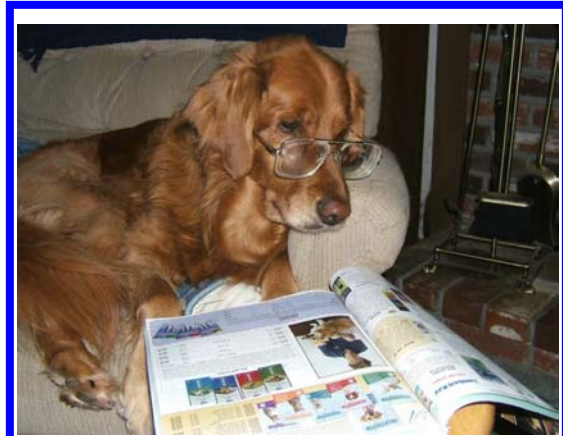

This past year over 90 dogs passed through Love A Golden Rescue's hands finding their way to new "forever" homes. This effort takes the hard work of our volunteers but it also takes cash. Funds are needed to pay for vet bills, microchipping, medication and a host of other needs. Our fundraising efforts are crucial to our work continuing unabated. We thank you for supporting our special fund raising events and for your direct donations to our Valentine Appeal, our Foster Buddy Program and to our new Golden Guardians program. Although these efforts are the backbone of our financial support, we would like you to know that you can assist Love A Golden in many smaller but very significant ways as you go about your daily business. Below we have listed our own TOP TEN (actually there are 11 but who's counting).

1. eScrip do you shop at Schnucks? This is an easy way to help Love a Golden Rescue, if you would like an escript card e-mail your name and address to Adoption@loveagolden.com, we will sign you up and mail an escript card to you, all you need to do is show your card when checking out at Schnucks and Love a Golden Rescue will receive 1 to 3 percent of your purchase.

7. MissionFish - Do you sell on e-bay? Love a Golden Rescue is a registered charity and a percentage of your sale can be donated to Love a Golden Rescue. Our bio becomes part of your sale.

GOLDEN GUARDIANS

We have a new way to donate to Love a Golden Rescue

We have established a new way for you to donate to Love a Golden Rescue. It is a Recurring Donation Plan called *Golden Guardians*. You can set it up to make a recurring monthly donation from your credit or debit card of \$10, \$20, \$30, \$50, \$75 or \$100. We have elected to use PayPal for this so it is easy to set up and is also secure.

Since forming in 2001, we have helped many Golden's find homes, including senior Golden's and Golden's with special needs. Some examples are Dixie, Kristy, and Cassie. Dixie is a senior Golden who has had extensive medical care and is now healthy and happy in her foster home. Kristy has undergone surgeries for urinary incontinence and is receiving care from specialists and holistic veterinarians. Cassie may need orthopedic surgery on her hips and knees. We try very hard to have fund raising events throughout the year to cover our expenses and appreciate the generosity of our donors. To be able to continue helping more dogs like these, we need additional help.

She likes to play with the other Goldens in her foster home. She is also very content to lie near you and snooze. She was a stray at a shelter so we don't know her history. She appears to be around 6 years old. She would like a loving

home of her own and would be a great companion.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Love A Golden Rescue had a very busy year last year and is looking forward to opportunities to help more Goldens this year. Last year we took in 94 dogs and finalized 92 adoptions. Of the intakes, 41 came to us from shelters and 53 were owner turn-ins. There were 46 females and 48 males. We treated 9 Goldens for heartworm. We also treated Goldens which tested positive for lyme and for ehrlichia, which have orthopedic problems beyond the typical arthritis, which have seizure disorders, which have allergies requiring special care and management, which had lumps that needed to be removed and some of which were cancerous, which had distemper, which needed surgery to repair a hematoma, which needed entropion surgery, and which needed to go to specialists. Eighteen of the intakes were estimated to be 9 years old or older.

Our focus remains on helping the individual Golden reach his or her forever home. For example, 11 year old Bessie recently came to us from life in a pen. She regards everyone as her friend. Unfortunately she had a number of lumps, including one as large as a grapefruit. She is now recovering from the extensive surgery to remove the lumps and is looking forward to a home where she gets lots of tummy rubs. Ten year old Isaac recently came to us from a shelter. His owner had turned him into the shelter because the owner got new carpets and no longer wanted dogs with the new carpet. Isaac is undergoing his veterinary check up and hopes to be ready for a new home soon, one where he is valued. Because of our volunteers, friends, and supporters, Love A Golden has been able to help these Goldens. You are what makes the happy stories for so many Goldens possible.

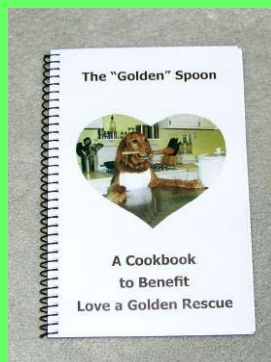
