## Team Work

Several weeks ago, the two golden rescues in St. Louis received a call about a breeder who had been told to shut down by the Missouri Department of Agriculture for a failed inspection. All the dogs needed to go. There were eight 8-month-old golden puppies, as well as adult doodles and a golden/collie mix. Both groups teamed up to assist these dogs. Dirk's Fund took the lead, for which we are grateful. We were able to secure foster homes for four of the puppies.

Dirk's Fund went to pick up the dogs, and this is a quote from their Facebook page. “Before daylight on the morning of January 10<sup>th</sup>, seven vehicles with 11 volunteers set out for Macon, Missouri to rescue 12 dogs from an Amish puppy mill that had been shut down by the Department of Agriculture for inhumane conditions. The farther north we drove, the more snow there was on the ground.

Everyone arrived at about 10 a.m., and we were surprised to see most of the dogs loose in the yard and driveway with several children. There were eight 8-month-old golden pups, a golden/collie mix, a male golden doodle and two 2-year-old female doodles. The goldens were social, likely due to interacting with the kids.

The Amish family was mostly cooperative, and the dogs were loaded into crates, and as each vehicle was loaded, we headed back.

We all met back at the local vet hospital that had agreed to take in all 12 and board them for a few days while they were being tested, vaccinated, and groomed. Each dog was tested for parvo before they were allowed out of the vehicles. Thankfully, all tested negative. The dogs were then taken inside where they were given warm quarters, water, and a meal. Most of the dogs had vomited on the return trip, and the contents of their stomachs consisted of vegetation...hay, grass or whatever. No dog food. The dogs were assessed, vaccinated, tested for worms, heartworm tested and groomed.”

On Friday January 12<sup>th</sup>, a LAGR volunteer went to pick up our four goldens, two boys and two girls. We were expecting the worst but were pleasantly surprised to receive four beautiful, groomed goldens, and on top of that, they were very friendly. Another surprise for which we were thankful.

Their foster homes came to pick them up, and off they went.

When we take in a group of puppies, we name them with the same beginning letter, so this group is the C puppies. Meet Chelsea, Crystal, Carter, and Chad. They are all very social and doing well. They will be spayed and neutered in the next few weeks. Then, they'll be ready for their forever homes.

### Here's an update on the puppies from their foster homes.

Chelsea - Chelsea is a lively and affectionate girl who is enjoying a warm home, regular meals (she *really* likes food!) and a variety of toys. It is amazing to me how well she has adapted to life outside the breeders. She is very ADD when we take her out... birds, wind, snow, blowing leaves, other dogs. There are so many new experiences, that she is unable to focus on what we really want her to do...potty! Chelsea sleeps in her crate from 11 pm until 7:30 am without any whining, crying or tantrums. She loves to nap with her head resting on our feet. She is an absolute slob at the water bowl! She dribbles water everywhere! Chelsea is a take-charge kind of girl and an expert at stealing toys from my 12-year-old dog. Her exuberance is too much for Lacey at times. Chelsea is very interested in the cat. However, after their first encounter, the cat has confined himself to the back of the house where Chelsea is not allowed to go.



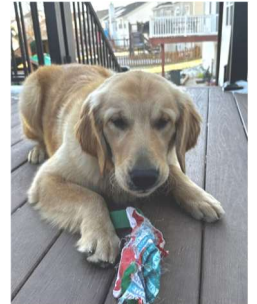

Crystal - Despite the impression you get from the pics, Crystal is no couch potato. She is seen here with her 10-year old sister Maggie and resting upside down without apparent concern. She does not do "puppy biting" but will chew a wide array of objects. Nighttime is no bother, as she sleeps through the night. Crystal picks up on our preferences quickly but is independent and persevering. Tennis balls work best for "fetch."



Carter - Carter is the happiest guy! He has such a typical golden personality. He is curious and non-stop playful. He loves toys, especially ones with squeakers! We are still getting to know each other, and he is working hard on learning house manners. Carter is already making some progress. He loves people and kids and gets along well with our 4-year-old golden.

He is potty trained, sleeps all night and is a joy. He has gotten car sick the few times he has been in the car. Chad loves being outside in the yard. The first night he was with us, he was offered a treat, and he was bewildered. The look on his face was priceless, then he saw his foster sisters take them. After that, no looking back, as he is in line for treats.

These four beautiful puppies--along with the dogs that Dirk's Fund took in--wouldn't have had a chance without rescues working together. We are so glad that all these dogs have a bright future--a forever life full of love, attention and lots of treats and cuddling... the kind of life *all* pets should have.

**Dear Lincoln,**

You are mourning Keeper. This is common when you lose a doggie family member. It also sometimes happens when you lose a human family member. You were very attached to each other, and you had lived with Keeper your whole life. Since he's gone, you have a hole in your heart.

Here are some of the symptoms of depression in dogs:

- being listless
- withdrawal from people and other pets
- a lack of appetite
- lethargic behavior and sleeping more than usual
- unusually aggressive or destructive behaviors
- inappropriate elimination within the home
- calling out or vocalizing in an unusual way for the dog who has passed away
- searching for the companion dog within the home and other places frequented by the other dog
- becoming very clingy to the owner and following the owner around

Humans believe we may not understand the concept of death, but we know they are missing, and this affects our behavior.

When Keeper was taken away, he must have been very sick or was in a lot of pain. Now Keeper is not feeling any more pain.

I hope you are doing better now too.

It has been over 2 years since I brought Sidney to his forever home. My "Whirling Dervish" has calmed down



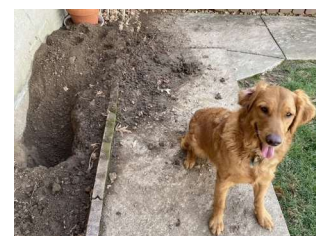

Rosie Mae is very happy with her digging accomplishment.



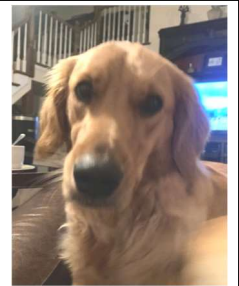

hesitant at any unfamiliar noises.

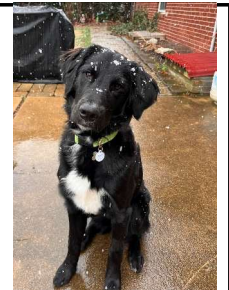
Autumn loves her doggie beds and relaxes in them throughout the day. She and Kona have chew toys and balls everywhere, and that makes us happy, because they know this is their home.

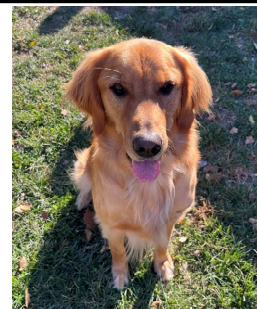

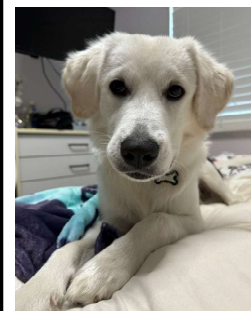
## The following four are littermate "F puppies"

Sam (was Felix) is living the good life in Colorado.

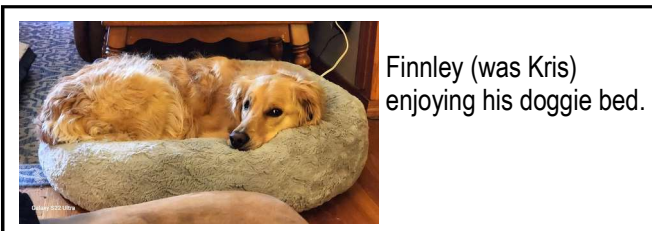

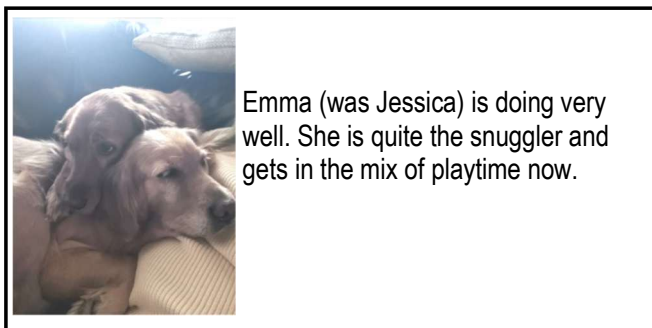


Romeo (was Finley) is doing great. He is the happiest and most energetic pup. He is also very spoiled as all pups should be.

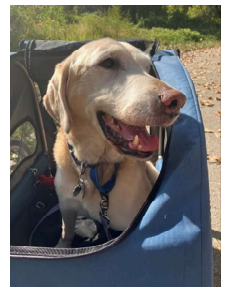

Our sweet girl Kassidy crossed the Rainbow Bridge on October 4, 2023. Kassidy was rescued by LAGR from the Kennett Humane Society at the end of June 2017. She came to us as a foster, and it didn't take long for us to realize she would be a foster failure. We adopted her just 3 weeks later.

In June 2020, we noticed a tennis ball size lump that appeared seemingly overnight. The vet diagnosed her with a stage 2 soft tissue sarcoma. She had surgery to remove it. At the end of May 2023 (just shy of 3 years later), another sarcoma developed, and it was in a difficult place to operate. We placed Kassidy on hospice.

During her last few months, Kassidy enjoyed riding in her bike trailer when her parents went on bike rides. We affectionately started referring to her as "the princess in her carriage." She loved meeting people on bike rides and walks. She would approach with a wagging tail anticipating people would pet her, and most of the time they did.

Kassidy loved going for walks, chasing bunnies and squirrels in the backyard, and playing fetch with her favorite tennis ball. She was the best girl. She never counter surfed and never chewed on anything but her bones and toys. We were so spoiled by her. We miss and love her, and she loved us unconditionally.



Keeper was an incredible golden, who never let his special needs get the better of him. As a three-month-old puppy, he was run over by a lawn mower. He came to rescue after being saved by a vet in Kentucky. His leg was removed, and all was good until he was 18-months old when his growth plate in his other rear leg did not close correctly. He went to Mizzou Veterinary Hospital, where he had an implant put in his leg. He had a wonderful life, he never got upset with other golden retrievers and the many fosters he lived with.
