SAD BEGINNING AND HAPPY ENDING

This is the tale of three doggies. Sit back and enjoy, and hopefully you will learn something from this cautionary story.

Once upon a time, there were two dogs from Turkey and one who was born in the USA and obtained as a puppy. All were much loved. All three were beloved by their family member.

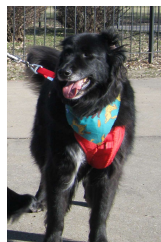
Silas came from Turkey in 2016. He had been found in the forest, and LAGR offered to take him. He was adopted and became a search and rescue dog. Lucy, also from Turkey, came in 2017. She had an adopted home arranged after all her vetting was done. Lucy had some orthopedic issues after being previously being hit by a car. She had her front leg removed and did very well. The third dog was Riley. He was born locally, and their mom took him into her pack. Three happy dogs and their mom—a wonderful family.

At the end of January, our rescue received a call that their owner had been found deceased in her home, and the dogs had been taken to a rural shelter. Luckily, a very good friend of their mom was aware they were LAGR dogs, and the Good Samaritan also knew of the clause in our contract, referencing for them to come back to us if things changed in their owners' living situation. When the owner is deployed and does not have any other options, when a family moves to a new place that does not allow dogs, we work together, to get their vet records and plan for them—the smoothest transition we can manage.

Three dogs. What were we going to do? We were able to make arrangements with our great friends at Kennelwood to board them, which meant we could take a moment before getting into high-gear and start making permanent arrangements. So, a road trip was arranged.

Even though Riley was not a LAGR dog, we could not leave him behind. We learned he was not up-to-date on his shots so on our first trip, we sadly had to leave him until we could arrange a vet visit. Lucy was happy to be on an adventure, but Silas seemed to be depressed. The last week had been devastating for them with so many changes. We knew they could not stay in boarding indefinitely, but what to do?

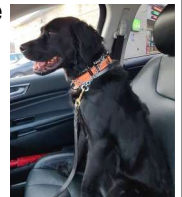
Then we got an email. One of our volunteers in St. Joseph was willing to foster Lucy and Silas. Our prayer was answered, and we will always be thankful. So, another road trip was arranged to Macon, a town that is halfway between St. Louis and St Joseph. It took time for them to adjust, and we learned they were not a bonded pair, so they could be split up and adopted into two different homes. That was helpful information to have. The following week, we went back to get Riley. He went to the vet and then Kennelwood. He was a wild boy and had to have training while there. (Kennelwood is a saving grace in so many ways!) Riley eventually went to a foster home, but he could not be trusted in the house and hated to be crated. So, he finagled his way into going to doggie day care at Kennelwood every day, which he loved. (And people think they have the superior mind over dogs. Ha! The joke's on them.) We received an application from someone for another dog. This dog was already adopted. In the conversation, Lucy was mentioned. Yes, they would like to meet her. Luckily, they lived on the west side of the state, so a meet-and-greet and a home visit were easily done. They fell in love—the rest is history. Lucy is now going to be a library reading dog, and her family adores her. And that's Lucy's happily-ever-after.



Silas thrived on his own, still being doted on in his foster home as an “only dog” once Lucy was adopted. Then we got an application from the good friend who had alerted us about their mom's death. Silas was familiar with this home, having visited a lot. He knew this lady. He knew her dogs. In fact, Silas was friends with her dogs. So, yet another road trip was arranged to get him back from St Joseph and to his new home many miles away. When he arrived, it was like “I am home.” He used their doggie door right away. He checked out their other dogs' food bowls (which was always his routine whenever he visited). He said hello to the resident pack. His tail wagging, the way he soaked up the love from his new mom was a loud and clear thank you. He had also found his happily-ever-after...

Then there was Riley. The high energy and party boy. Who was going to adopt him? We had taken in three dogs—we could not stop trying with one left. Then another miracle inquiry. “We are interested in Riley.” It was music to our ears. The foster home contacted them, did a home visit, and it was a great match. Riley's forever family have another young dog, and they are an active family. It was a perfect fit.

The moral to this story is this (if you have not already figured it out): think about what will happen to your animals should something happen to you. (And let's face it. Something is going to happen to all of us.) Discuss it with your family. Your friends. Your neighbors. Put a note on the refrigerator with all the necessary contact information to ensure your pups and kitties do not suffer. Include your dog's shot records (label them clearly, in an envelope) because if your pup has to go to boarding, those records will be necessary. You just never know...

Dear Golden Friends,

Thank you to all who donated to Give STL Day and our Valentine Appeal. We appreciate your generosity. Every year, we are amazed and grateful for everyone's kindness. Without the help from everybody—foster homes, volunteers, donors—we could not do what we do.

So far this year, we have taken in 16 dogs. We have rescued goldens, golden mixes as well as other dogs in desperate need, such as a 6-year-old Labradoodle who needed a place to go urgently and a goldendoodle, Lexie, who has Addison's disease. They are retrievers, right? They should automatically retrieve a ball when they see one, right? Nope. Three dogs tried, but apparently were overwhelmed by the number of balls. Finally, Cassidy got the job done. The winning ball was 482. Tammy S. was the winner. Thanks to all who participated. It was funny, but also fun.

We will again do a calendar for 2025. Be on the lookout in June for a mailer requesting photos and get them to us prior to the deadline. What a great way to show off your adopted dog. Imagine it—your pup could be on the cover—or on one of the monthly pages of our gorgeous calendar.

This year, our reunion picnic is scheduled for September 21st. We look forward to this event every year. It is so enjoyable seeing so many dogs in one location, along with their wonderful forever families. We hope to see you there. This year, the theme is circus, and we will have a costume contest. We are excited, because we have a great backdrop for some wonderful photo opportunities. Please mark your calendar for 9/21/2024, get some fun "circus" stuff to wear (for you and your four-legged friend), and plan to get your photo taken (it is free). Shadow is a 6-year-old neutered Labradoodle. He's very well behaved. He can sit, go down, stay, come when called and will proudly give you his paw. He's housebroken and will alert you when he needs to go potty/ outside. He is also crate trained and rides well in the car.

Shadow comes from a home where he was the only dog but is getting along well with his two foster brothers and sisters and has had no trouble blending in. He can entertain himself and enjoys a good game of fetch and looking out the windows to see what's going on. He has gone to work with his foster mom and hung out in her office and is a perfect co-worker.

He does get on the couch but will sit at one end and will move if you tell him "Off." He sleeps on a dog bed but waits for the invitation to get in the people's bed and settles at his end and doesn't move all night. His foster mom has left him loose in the house for up to 5 hours with no issues. He's very sweet and likes to give "kisses" and has a funny personality when he plays and stretches his long legs.

He does need some improvement on walking on a leash, but his foster mom is working on that.

Gretchen's Guidance

I often wonder why my mom and dad are so stingy with treats. I mean, I want a treat every time I come in, and I want a *whole treat*. They break treats into smaller pieces and give me just a nubbin, or they pick the kind of treats that are already small. Not fair! But maybe my mom and dad are trying to keep me healthy. Maybe I need to stop complaining.

I decided to investigate. I usually get a couple of mini treats or sometimes Charlie Bears when they leave, before bed or if I am really good (the times I am good are few and far between). I need to point out that I eat twice a day, and my food is tasty. However, I still like my treats.

Some dogs have told me they get some very large treats along with yummy meals. I look at their waistline (some of them don't even *have* a waistline) and that got me thinking.

Following is what I discovered as I conducted my research. I tested three sizes of Milk Bones and Charlie Bears.

- a large Milk Bone biscuit has 115 calories
- a medium Milk Bone has 40 calories
- a mini biscuit has 5 calories
- a Charlie Bear has 3 calories a piece

More than a hundred calories for a treat that I'll forget five minutes after I've gobbled it down? That's crazy!

I looked up a brand of Pro Plan and noted a cup has 379 calories... and my brain shifted into high gear. If I have 1 ½ cup twice a day of Pro Plan and two large biscuits I would be eating almost 1300 calories a day. (Ugh. I had to do math to figure this out.)

My suggestion for you doggie friends is to look at the calories in your dog food and the calories for the treats and adjust. If you get lots of caloric treats, have your mom and dad cut back on your dog food. Or, switch to low-calorie treats. (I love Charlie Bears, my mom gets them from Trader Joe's, and I can eat more than 30 of them to equal just one large Milk Bone. I guess I will never get to enjoy that many in one day, however, because I'm never good that many times a day. What can I say? I love being the mischief maker, the middle-of-the-night alarm clock, the party girl.)

I did find this guideline, but looking at online charts gives varied recommendations.

Dogs 10 lbs. 200 to 275 calories a day

Dogs 20 lbs. 325 to 400 calories a day

Dogs 50 lbs. 700 to 900 calories a day

Dogs 70 lbs. 900 to 1050 calories a day

Dogs 90 lbs. 1100 to 1350 calories a day

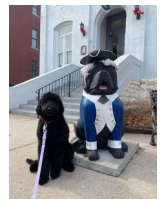
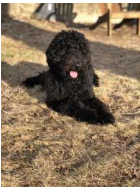

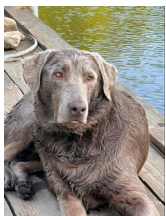


Happy Endings

We have been working on some manners with a trainer, but otherwise he's doing amazing. We love him to pieces.

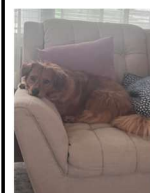
